SIS Parent Conference



On May 30th, SIS held a parent conference. The main reason for this conference was to up date the parents on the changes that will be happening for the next school year and to field any questions that the parents had about those changes. Some of the changes that were discussed for the next school year was the change in the school system, use of an overhead system with camera, and the use of smart pads for the higher readers.

The changes for the school system will be a change from the grade level system (i.e. grade 1, grade 2, grade 3....) to the WOW (World of Wonders) system. The WOW system will put the students in their respective levels for English and Math classes. The students have already

taken a placement test to see what level (i.e. level 1, level 2...) they will enter for those two classes. Now all we have left to do is to see how it will go next year. We are hoping that this system will help the students learn at the level they need to learn and will help them accelerate into the proper level they need to be in. But once again, this remains to be seen in the next school year. Teacher Chris and Teacher Jumar have made an overhead

system with a camera for the purpose of using it as a visual aid resource to help with Math and also reading. Instead of using the blackboard, the teacher can use this device to show all the students at once what is being taught. This is the shift from the traditional to the technological teaching methods that these kids are much more inclined to want to use.

SIS is also using smart pads for higher readers. They will be using the smart pad for downloading reading materials for their reading class. In this technological age, these students will be able to read better using up to date technology. We really hope that these will be used to the best possible way so that the students will be able to learn a lot from it.
